Key Findings and Discussions

Comparing #TheNigeriaWeHave vs #TheNigeriaWeWant Progress Made:

- Significant strides in the digital economy, largely driven by youth innovation.
- Increased tax remittances and government allocation.
- Youth inclusion in governance, characterized by youth appointments, the separation of the Ministry of Youths from Sports, and the appointment of 2 youth Ministers.

Areas Lacking Progress:

- Inflation has risen from 22% to over 33%, with a struggling economy and excessive government borrowing.
- Insecurity, particularly farmer-herder clashes, has worsened.
- The quality of life for the average Nigerian has not improved significantly.
- Calls for policy changes centered on citizens' needs remain unaddressed.

Broader Advocacy Beyond Politics and Economics

 It was highlighted that sectors beyond politics and economics, such as social justice, healthcare, and education, need more advocacy to drive holistic national development.





Key Findings and Discussions cont'd.

Challenges and Solutions in Achieving #TheNigeriaWeWant Challenges:

- Long-standing issues stemming from years of neglect.
- · Lack of clarity among Nigerian youth about their aspirations.
- Government overspending on non-essential items while citizens suffer.

Solutions:

- Promoting active citizenship to hold the government accountable.
- Engaging in activities that align with the vision of #TheNigeriaWeWant.

Effective Engagement Strategies with the Government

- Advocates need to leave a lasting legacy similar to the founding fathers.
- Utilizing both online and offline platforms to voice concerns and mobilize support.
- Promoting the role of youth in political processes.

Transparency and Accountability:

- Recognize the transient nature of power and make impactful decisions within limited time frames.
- Ensure financial and operational transparency to build trust and foster development.

- Youths should unite across Nigeria and globally to achieve #TheNigeriaWeWant.
- Youths avoid divisive politics and focus on unity.
- Push for policy implementation at all government levels and local government autonomy.
- Hold the government accountable for public projects and policies.
